Home Learning Opportunities

We put a focus on communication and language at nursery; this helps children to develop their speaking, listening and understanding skills.

 We have a preschool library where children take a book each week which is then returned and swapped the following week.

Parent Training & Workshops


Staff News

Tickets needed to visit Santa's grotto.


